

Solicitors with the will to raise funds for children's hospice

A LEGAL team has launched a drive to encourage families with young children to write a will.

Mayo Wynne Baxter aims to use the Family Footprints awareness campaign to raise £10,000 for children's hospice Chestnut Tree House.

Peggy Hall, a partner at Mayo Wynne Baxter, said: "People put off writing a will, not realising that if they die their property, pets and even children may go to someone other than who they want them to be left with. People with young families are busy, may not have much money to spare and often don't realise the risk.

"We are trying to tackle this wills timebomb by raising awareness of the problem and offering good value, professional wills which will safeguard families for a fixed price of £150. We will donate £25 for every will we write through the campaign to Chestnut Tree House."
