My ROTW is the second single to come from the current Amy Winehouse album 'Lioness: Hidden Treasures' – her cover of 'Will You Still Love Me Tomorrow' and released on the 6th of February.

Amy Winehouse's "Lioness:Hidden Treasures", an album that stands as a testament to Amy's exceptional talent and has received overwhelming critical acclaim entered the Official UK Album Chart at number 1 – selling almost 200,000 copies in a week, it was the 11th biggest selling album of 2011. The album was compiled by long-time musical partners Salaam Remi and Mark Ronson in close association with Amy's family, management and record label Island Records, and proves a fitting tribute to the artist, the talent and the woman. "Lioness : Hidden Treasures" is Amy's second number 1 album in 2011 following "Back To Black" which topped the UK charts for 3 weeks earlier this year. This is the second single to come from the album – following the massive success of

'Our day will come'.
